Fuchu-cho is a small, but independent town enveloped by Hiroshima city. It extends about 4.18 km from east to west and about 5.2 km from north to south. It has an area of approximately 10.45 square km.

In Japanese, "fuchu" means "the place of central government in olden times". In the past, Fuchu was the center of politics and culture in the Aki province, where is the western part of Hiroshima prefecture.

In 1889, it was renamed Fuchu-son (village) and in 1937, it became designated as "town".

From 1960 to 1975, the population exploded, but since 1975 it has slowed down. In 2011, the population of Fuchu-cho was 51,134.
